Overview

Mental Health Community Service Workers provide basic care, therapy and assistance to patients with mental illness or developmental disabilities. Mental Health Workers provide, assistance with daily activities, monitor their patients' conditions and assist in administering therapeutic care. They usually work under the direct supervision of a Registered Nurse as part of a nursing team. Mental Health Workers generally work in psychiatric hospitals, and residential mental health facilities.
